SOS: Thanks to Year 13s who gave their time to support Year 9 students transitioning to secondary school. Our new students are settling well into college life.

NCEA Review and Reconsideration: Applications for reconsiderations for NCEA externally assessed standards close on Friday 17 February and for scholarships on Friday 3 March.

Parent forum: Our first parent forum for this year will take place on Thursday 16 February in the Hub.
