"Sweating the Small Stuff"

## Students are reminded of the following uniform/grooming expectations when returning in 2019:

- No facial piercings allowed, e.g. nose or lip no clear spacers either
- One gold or silver stud per ear no spacers allowed in other piercing holes
- Long hair must be tied back and out of the face this applies to both boys and girls
- · Haircuts and styles must be clean and tidy
- Black hair ties only no other colours and no scrunchies
- Boys must be clean shaven at all times
- Light makeup only for girls
- Tattoos must be covered up
- Students must apply for a permanent pass to be able to wear a taonga or pendant of spiritual or sentimental significance this must then be worn under the shirt/blouse and not be visible
- No chewing gum allowed at school
- Girls must wear school ties even under jerseys or jackets
- When summer sandals are broken or not available, then the winter shoes and socks/stockings are the expected alternative
