

## COVID Level 2 Guidelines

Kia ora Parents and Whānau

As you will have heard, we are going to COVID Alert Level 2. We have put the following in place:

- All Pokeno, Hunua and Orere Point buses have been cancelled for the next three days.
- Any students who **live in the Auckland zone** must stay home until further notice, notification is expected Friday night.
- After speaking with the Ministry, we are asking that households who have parents or members of their household **working in Auckland** keep their children home for the remainder of the week. Safety and the wellbeing of all needs to be our first consideration. Thanks for your co-operation.
- All students can access their work online. Students who are needing to stay at home and who have **assessments** due will be given additional time for these.
- Students at home are encouraged to keep up-to-date with their learning by accessing course materials and activities on **Google Classroom**. If they are unsure what they need to be doing then they can email their subject teacher in the first instance.
- **Social distancing** is in place as much as is practical. We are reinforcing the “Hands off” and “Keeping space” within classrooms and at break times.
- Students are **sanitising** hands as they enter and leave rooms and desks and Chromebooks are being sanitised each lesson.
- Students have been asked to keep a record of where they have been and who they have seen throughout the day. Other contact tracing such as buses and bathrooms is in place.
- Good hygiene practices are being reinforced such as coughing into one’s elbow and washing hands regularly.
- It is important that students stay at home if they are at all unwell.
- Unfortunately the Te Kuiti Sports Exchange is cancelled as is today’s Careers Expo experience.
- With regard to other sporting events, we will keep students informed.
