You may have heard on the news about arrangements that schools may make to enable NCEA **Levels 2 and 3 students** to return. This provision is essentially for Auckland schools who have no other students on site. After considering the stringent conditions, we cannot manage these students safely while other students are on site.

We appreciate that school work has suddenly become much harder for students impacted by the Auckland region going into Lockdown Level 3. Please be assured that on return, we are offering **catch up opportunities** including tutorials in November and early December for those still struggling to achieve their NCEA qualification.

We are also mindful of equity with regards to **Junior students** who are learning from home and this will be taken into account when grading assessments.

Wellbeing is an important consideration for students learning from home. The Ministry has some helpful tips for students for taking care of themselves on this site.
