Monday Catch Up Day for students impacted by Alert Level 3 Lockdown: To support the Alert Level 3 students, Monday 31 August is designated as a catch up day for those Alert Level 3 students to spend time with their teachers in a more focused way. We urge these students to make the most of this opportunity. If there are any changes to the Alert Levels over the weekend we will communicate our arrangements as soon as possible.

Other students i.e. those who have continued to attend school over the past three weeks are not required to attend school on this day but **may do so** if the student or parent wishes it.

All buses will run as normal including the Hunua bus.

We have been advised by the Ministry of Education that **face masks or face coverings** are not required to be worn on school buses or buses chartered to transport students, as good systems are in place to identify potential close contacts. Buses will be sanitised after each school run and it is important that students who are unwell stay at home.

Similarly, face masks or coverings are not required to be worn at school.

Those students who are signed up for the **First Aid** course must attend school.

Any students who received **Chromebooks** under Alert Level 3 must bring these back to school on Monday. They can be returned to Mr O'Neill in Room 20B immediately after arrival.

Senior Progress Reports for Semester B are being given out on Thursday 3 September. If parents have any queries or concerns please contact your child's River Guide.

Tutorials are being offered during *Step it Up!* time for senior students. This is a further strategy in place to ensure students are given extra support in achieving their NCEA qualifications.
