# **COVID Update**

Thank you to those parents who are continuing to inform us regarding COVID positive cases in your household.

Over the past week, we have had 25 students who have tested positive for COVID and a further 17 students who are isolating.

Clearly, and especially with winter on the way, we are going to need to adjust to this as an ongoing reality. We have been advised by the Ministry that there could well be a surge in COVID cases as well as a rise in winter flu's.

While we continue to take measures against the spread of COVID including air purifiers in spaces where the air flow is not as good, we urge students to continue to be careful particularly in the wearing of face masks and refraining from sharing food and drink.

# **Transition to Winter Uniform**

### Winter Shoes

The only acceptable winter school shoes, as indicated in our uniform requirements in the HPC Prospectus, are black leather lace-up school shoes with a heel of no more than 5cm. There are already a number of students wearing incorrect school shoes – those may be advertised in the shoe store as school shoes, but



they are not acceptable under our Board Policy. Thanks for ensuring your child is in correct uniform.
