Welcome back to Term two and hopefully everyone enjoyed the break.

Buses

Thank you for your patience earlier this week with a couple of late buses to contend with.

Thames Bus: we are still waiting on word from *Go Bus* when the hoped for Thames run can be reinstated.

We have had incidents this past week of students allegedly vaping and / or smoking marijuana on one of the bus runs. The driver has been unable to identify exactly who is responsible and we urge students to pass on any information so this can be addressed. Confidentiality will be protected.

Students have been warned that if they are identified as vaping or involved in any form of drugs on the school bus, that there will be serious consequences at school and be removed off the bus possibly for the rest of the year.

Teacher Accord Day

Thursday 12th May is a Staff Professional Development day (Teachers only). This has been provided by the Ministry to all secondary schools throughout NZ to work on significant changes to NCEA which are coming in next year.

We will be working with a Ministry advisor on the new literacy and numeracy requirements at NCEA Level 1 which will impact on current Years 9 and 10 students in future years.

COVID Update

It feels good to have school almost back to 'normal' under the *Orange* framework.

Masks are not required generally during the school day either outdoors or in classes but we are expecting students to wear a mask at school assemblies (either Monday or Tuesday morning).

The reason for this is that a large number of students are in a relatively confined space. Generally assemblies last for no more than 20 minutes, so mask wearing is reassuring for those who

are concerned about the spread of Covid.

Masks are still required on school buses.

People who have genuine reasons for not being able to wear a face mask, can access a new personalised exemption card from the end of May. These cards can be applied for through the Ministry of Health Link.

From what we understand, bus drivers will be expecting students to show this card to demonstrate that they are mask exempt.

Attendance

Under *Orange*, all students are expected to be back at school and attending regularly. Although teachers will put up an overview of the week's work online Monday morning, it is not expected that teachers are teaching students online.

Please contact the school if there are any reasons why your child cannot return to school.

Thank you for those parents who are keeping us informed when your child had contacted Covid or is isolating for 7 days.
