Sickbay/Medication Held for Students

As per our policy we need to have permission slips signed by parents whose students have medication held in the Sickbay, the Student Centre will email these to parents to complete and return forms. If we do not receive a form, we will be unable to hand medication to your child.

Passes Out of School

For safety reasons, it is essential that the school knows the whereabouts of students at all times during the school day. Students who need to leave the school grounds for any reason during the school day need a Street Pass. This is issued by the Deputy Principal and requires a written note from home. Street passes are not issued to buy lunch or food downtown; rather they are for things like going to the doctor, picking up a script from the pharmacy or a meeting/interview at a business.
