Thank you for your cooperation with the Ministry accorded Teacher Only Day last Friday. It was a valuable time to get our heads around some of the changes ahead and what needs to happen to prepare for these.

#### Step It Up

For the last few weeks of the term (starting yesterday), we have developed a *Step It Up* programme designed to give students experiences they would not normally have the opportunity for and to ensure that we keep students engaged until the end of the year.

### Year 10 Option Subjects 2023

Students have been given a Subject Guide explaining options available to them in 2023 during an assembly on Thursday. Students will be asked to choose four options from the list, with a term spent on each option.

These booklets will be brought home for whānau / parents / caregivers to support choices and River Guides will also discuss with students. The students need to have chosen their options by Monday 28 November.

To select their options students need to complete the Google Form on the Year 9 Google Classroom page. There is also an electronic version of the Subject Guide on Google Classroom.

## Year 10 Prizegiving

The Year 10 Junior Diploma Prizegiving will be held at 9:30am on Thursday 1 December.

We ask that Year 9s remain home that day to enable as many staff as possible to attend the prizegiving.

The ceremony normally takes around an hour and a half and students are welcome to go home with whānau / parents / caregivers after the event. All are welcome!

## Year 10 Camp

Students who are going on a camp are not required to attend school the other two days for the week of Monday 5 to Friday 9 December.

Those students not attending either group 1 or group 2 camp are expected to attend school during that week.

Students had a meeting today to sort tent groups and advise them on what they need to organise regarding food, tents etc. They all have a booklet with information. Please review this with them to ensure their group has all the required equipment. We have some spare tents and cookers if needed.
