Celebrating Success



Vaping

We are worried about the number of young people making poor choices about vaping at school.

- From <u>https://vapingfacts.health.nz/vapefree-schools/supporting-students.html</u> :
 - Vaping contains nicotine which can have some negative effects on brain development in adolescents
 - Vaping contains unregulated chemicals and flavours whose long-term effects are unknown.

If students need support to quit vaping they are recommended to get advice from a health professional, such as a doctor or our health nurse. A reminder that it is prohibited to vape on school property or grounds 24/7. It is also illegal to sell or give a vaping product to someone under 18. Vaping is not permitted on buses, students caught vaping could lose the privilege on being able to travel on our school buses.

Here are our consequences for vaping or suspicion of vaping. Please note at all stages, families will be notified and counselling offered to student:

- 1. Suspicion of vaping Dean will talk to student
- 2. Repeated suspicion of vaping DP will talk to student
- 3. Student in possession of vaping paraphernalia* Deans service
- 4. Student in possession of vape* 1 hour Community Service
- 5. Student physically vaping on school grounds 5 hour Community Service and family notified
- 6. Repeated vaping Principal consideration of stand down

* Regardless of who owns the item
