## Yr 11 Subject Selection for 2024 (current Yr 10's)

The online Schoolpoint portal for subject selection is now open and students need to go to the Year 10 google classroom for the link and instruction video. This portal is open until Friday 18th of August. Link to Y11 course outline booklet. Link to instruction video.

### Yr 12 and 13 Subject Evening for 2024

Thank you to the 150+ parents and students who attended our information evening on Thursday. A few points to clarify:

- Full year courses
- 2024 Yr 12s to choose 6 courses, Yr 13s to choose 5 or 6 courses (study class for those who choose 5 courses)
- No compulsory courses
- No prerequisites in Year 12
- Students will be able to choose their courses from Monday, using the Schoolpoint online portal
- Students who still do not have their NCEA Literacy/Numeracy requirement will be guided into courses to help them achieve this
- More Gateway / Work Experience placements have been made available next year
- Opportunity for students to enrol in a full year, 1-day per week Wintec Trades Academy course. Transport to Hamilton provided
  L2 and L3 credits will be gained
  - Limited places available so an interview process will be taken
  - Course include hairdressing, landscaping, exercise science, electrical engineering, cookery and more

### **Out of Zone Applications**

Please note, the ballot for out of zone students (<u>even if they already have a sibling at school</u>) closes at midday Wednesday 23 August 2023.

This week we had 100 students and parents attend our final Out of Zone Evening. Given the predicted in zone students coming from primary schools, we have around 55 Out of Zone places for Yr 9 students in 2023. We currently have a list of 40 Out of Zone priority applications, for example students who have siblings here or their parents attended. This means our Out of Zone numbers for those they don't meet the priority criteria are sitting around 15. A huge thank you to our students Eleanor Clarkin, Ben Shackleton, John Upfold, Jack Pallister, Tahlia Warburton, and Trinity Gover for organising, supporting and speaking at our event. Also a huge thanks to Mary Aislabie for her ongoing work with our Out of Zone applications, she is the one doing all the heavy lifting and we really appreciate her efforts.

The following information regarding our Health Consultation was emailed to parents last Friday (please check your emails). We ask for written submissions before Wednesday 23rd August.






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# A note about Yr 9 and 10 GPAs

We have been fielding a few queries and hope this helps:

- The GPAs this year are calculated using different weightings. Progress in a class now has a weighting, but there is no weighting for curriculum level achievement (this is because the curriculum changes in 2027 are moving towards a progress rather than attainment focus)
- We have noticed a large discrepancy in GPA scores from Semester A to Semester B. This could be down to a number of factors e.g. change in teachers with English and Humanities alternating each term, progress grades being more about achievement level rather than gains made, option subjects changing etc.
- We are looking for a new approach to reporting next year which we anticipate will increase transparency and accuracy. We wonder if the GPA has run its course and is not serving its purpose any longer.
