Whānau Hui Success

On Tuesday 14th of May we had 30 students, 25 whānau and 10 staff attend the Whānau Hui. Please keep a look out for a feature in the upcoming Valley Profile. Together we celebrated 'he kākano' - some of the seeds and successes that are developing at HPC:

- Increase in Māori staff
- · Reestablishment of a Te Reo Māori department with its own Curriculum Leader
- Increase in ākonga choosing to study Te Reo Māori and Māori Cultural Studies
- Te Reo Māori available at all year levels
- 70 ākonga taking part in Kapa Haka
- Te Whare Manaaki a space for ākonga requiring additional pastoral support underpinned by Māori values
- Māori students in 2023 achieved a 94% success rates in NCEA Level 2, which was exactly the same as the overall HPC pass rate in NCEA Level 2
- Widening Tikarahi (Māori student) council with ākonga taking specific leadership portfolios
- More ākonga proudly wearing their taonga
- More training across the school for kaiako and ākonga to learn Tikanga and Te Reo Māori through karakia, waiata, and haka powhiri
- Iwi representation on the HPC Board
- New wharenui in discussion with iwi!

Common Assessment Activities (CAA)

From 29th-31st May, we will be running the CAAs at school. These are the NCEA Reading, Writing and Numeracy exams. The majority of our current Year 11s sat these last year. Year 11s who did not pass any of the three exams last year will re-sit those exams in this testing window. Many of our Year 10s will also sit these exams during this window. When deciding which Year 10s we will enter into the exams we will consider their academic level and readiness for the exams.

School to Skies

Following our visit from NZDF in term 1, it was a pleasure to welcome further members from the Royal New Zealand Air Force, who came to HPC to talk to students about possible career opportunities. Students were able to learn more about the different aircraft the RNZAF uses, what kinds of operations they are used for, from humanitarian purposes to transporting the Prime Minister and senior members of the Royal family. Pilots were generally the airforce personnel front and centre of students' minds however, they were able to learn about some of the other kinds of roles that are required to support a pilot flying a Hercules, Boeing or NH90 helicopter, particularly aircraft technicians, logistics personnel, physical trainers, flight stewards, refuelling technicians,









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marshalls, load master and medics just to name a few.
