## Paeroa College Consultation Notice - from the Ministry of Education

The Ministry of Education has identified that Paeroa College is overcrowded and has given the school Board notice of this. After consultation with the Board, we have developed a proposed enrolment scheme for Paeroa College under section 72 of the Education and Training Act 2020. As part of this process, we are consulting with the school's community and with people living in the area for which the school is a reasonably convenient school. The enrolment scheme could affect which school a student will be entitled to enrol in, or school transport entitlements. Students who have been enrolled in the Health and Safety courses are expected to uphold their part of the Gateway contract agreement by undertaking a work placement. For those students who have not yet found their placement by the start of Term 3, we will be organising an internal/on-site experience for you so that you can fulfil the requirements of the programme.

This week we have taken delivery of the Inzone kiosk (pictured right). This is a digital service which allows students to explore pathways, employment sectors and localised opportunities. It's already proving to be very popular with students using the careers centre.

We also welcomed back the Youth Workers Resource Centre this week who presented a workshop to more than 40 of our Year 11 students. This is the starting point for students wishing to engage with the Gateway programme or take part in some Work Experience. All forms need to be returned to Mrs Scott at the start of Term 3 if work placements are to proceed in 2024. Further health and safety courses for those eligible will be scheduled for early in 2025 as appropriate. If you have expressed an interest in a STAR course, you will have already received an



email. There are only limited STAR opportunities remaining in Term 3 and the best advice for most students will be to focus on your internal assessments and external preparation, rather than trying to squeeze more into your schedule.

The AUT and University of Auckland Open Days this year are on the same date - Saturday August 24th. We will have our University liaisons returned to Hauraki Plains College in Term 3 to speak further with students about applications and course selection - so keep an eye on the notices.
