Transition to Winter Uniform

From Monday 31st March (Week 10) until Friday, 9th May (Term 2 Week 2), we will have a transition period from summer to winter uniform. This will give families 6 weeks to get winter uniforms sorted out. During this time students may wear either summer or winter uniform, but not a combination of both, e.g. no scarf with sandals. By Monday, 12th May all students are expected to be in the correct winter uniform.

Acceptable Winter School Shoes: Going

into winter uniform it is appropriate for whānau/parents to know what our expectations are. The only acceptable winter school shoes, as indicated in our uniform requirements in the HPC prospectus, are black leather lace up school shoes with a heel of no more than 5 cm (as shown in the image). There are often a number of students wearing incorrect school shoes – they may be advertised in the shoe store as



school shoes, but they are not acceptable under our policy. Please make sure your children are in the correct footwear.
