## **Transition to Winter Uniform**

From now until Friday, 9 May (Term 2 Week 2), we are in a transition period from summer to winter uniform. From the start of this transition, it gives whānau/families 6 weeks to get winter uniforms sorted out. During this time students may wear either summer or winter uniform, but not a combination of both, e.g. no scarf with sandals. By Monday, 12 May all students are expected to be in the correct winter uniform.

Acceptable Winter School Shoes: Going into winter uniform it is appropriate for whānau/parents to know what our expectations are. The only acceptable winter school shoes, as indicated in our uniform requirements in the HPC prospectus, are black leather lace up school shoes with a heel of no more than 5 cm (as shown in the image). There are often a number of students wearing incorrect school shoes – they may be



advertised in the shoe store as school shoes, but they are not acceptable under our policy. Please make sure your children are in the correct footwear.
