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BOT Elections

The school triennial Board Of Trustees election will take place in Term 3 this year. Our election day is 8th September 2025. Leaving School During the Day

A reminder to all families that students are not permitted to leave school during the day unless special arrangements have been made. This includes things like medical appointments, which must be communicated to the school by a parent or caregiver, either verbally or in writing. If a student needs to leave, they must sign out at the office before doing so.

Please note: if a student arrives at school by bus, they are considered to be under school supervision from the moment they step off the bus. They are not allowed to go into town before coming on site.

Year 13 students are allowed to leave school grounds at interval and lunchtime, but this is a privilege, not a right. We monitor behaviour closely, and if any issues arise, this permission may be revoked. We expect Year 13s to role model responsible behaviour while offsite.

Students who live in Ngatea must also go straight to school in the morning. Going into the shops before school is not permitted.

Thanks for your support in helping us keep students safe, focused and where they need to be during the school day.

Health Education Consultation
