## CAA (Common Assessment Activity a.k.a. Lit/Num exam) Dates

The CAA exams will be administered next week starting on Monday 1-3 September. Most Year 10 students and a number of Year 11s and 12s will be involved with these. Students have been issued with timetables. They need to catch up with Mr Jaco Dreyer if they have any questions. Students bringing their own devices to use for the CAAs must ensure that they have at least 2 hours of battery time.

To use the text-to-speech function in the Writing and Numeracy exams, students are allowed to use head phones/ear buds - the need to ensure it is compatible with their device/school Chromebook. For the Numeracy exam students can use a calculator - it is preferable for students to have their own, because we don't have enough calculators to lend out.

#### Waste Audit

With the support of Kate Whitton, the Waste Minimisation Officer at Hauraki District Council and Ian Clark, our wonderful caretaker. This audit was led by Ruby McKay, our Student Environmental Council Leader, as we conducted the most comprehensive waste survey



ever done at HPC to learn what items we send to landfill and which areas of the school generate what type and volume of waste. Every indoor and outdoor space on the school grounds had its rubbish collected over two days, and sorted by over 50 students in a fast-paced session the following morning. The results will inform our ongoing efforts in waste and recycling management.

#### Pare Hauraki Native Nursery Visit

Horticulture and Environmental Studies students had an exciting visit to Pare Hauraki Native Nursery in Thames. During our visit, led by Jamie Nisbet, he shared the incredible story of this iwi-led

initiative and its sustainable practices, including ecosourcing local seeds from mature forests to grow all their plants, which they sell and plant across our region. Our students demonstrated whanaungatanga by gifting their time to help propagate plants before heading back to HPC. Students found this visit



inspirational and informative, which will support our school efforts as we continue to grow thousands of native plants a year in our very own native nursery.
