


Kia ora koutou and welcome to the third week of Term Four.

#### **CAA Results Now Available**

Common Assessment Activity (CAA) results are now live on students' *myNZQA* accounts. If they did not pass this year, there will be two further opportunities to complete the CAA's next year. Students can also meet the required 10 Literacy and 10 Numeracy credits through their regular NCEA internal and external assessments, which are approved as equivalent corequisites during the 2024–2027 transition period. For more information, visit the NZQA website for the list of approved LIT/NUM standards/courses. If you are concerned, please reach out to your child's Maths or English teachers for more specific information.

## Special Assessment Conditions (SAC) for 2026

As we approach the end of Year 10 and look ahead to NCEA next year, we are beginning the process of identifying students who may qualify for <u>Special Assessment Conditions (SAC)</u>. This process takes time, as it involves gathering evidence, trialling supports, and submitting applications to NZQA for consideration.



### Gateway

New programmes for 2025 included "Hot Shots" barista training and the chainsaw and forestry course with Silvipath. Many students who undertook these courses have been able to find part-time work or paid employment as a result of their training and qualifications gained. Great job!

Further new courses are being developed for 2026 to offer students training, credits and work experiences which specifically align to the different strands of the vocational pathways. Students are welcome to make an appointment to speak with Mrs Lawlor or Mrs Scott to discuss their specific interests.
