


Kia ora koutou and welcome to Week One of Term One!

Year 11 NCEA Information Evening – Thursday, 12th February, 6:00–7:00 PM

This event is for Year 11 students, parents, and anyone wanting to upskill their knowledge of NCEA. Students from our Academic Council will be supporting this event and will be available to answer your questions from a student perspective.

All Year Levels: Meet the River Guide Evening – Tuesday, 3rd of March, 6:00–7:30 PM

River Guides are your students' champions – they are your child's biggest advocates, mentors, supporters, and cheerleaders here at HPC. Each morning, River Guides meet with their River groups to take the roll, check uniforms, read the notices, and check in with students. On Mondays, this time is extended to include assembly and learning activities. River Guides are your first point of contact if you need help or have questions. It is important to connect with your student's River Guide and get to know them – we warmly encourage ALL students and their families to attend this evening. Google Classroom

Every class at HPC has a Google Classroom where teachers post activities and work for students. Parents/caregivers of Year 9 students and other new students will receive an email in Week 3 inviting them to subscribe to summaries of activity from their child's Google Classroom subject sites. These summaries, sent daily or weekly (depending on preference), provide a snapshot of each week's learning focus and upcoming assignments.

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Frequently asked questions at this time of year!

- **I haven't quite got the right uniform yet** – Please don't panic. We can write a uniform pass for you until you get it sorted. Before river time, students need to bring a note from home to the front office and write their name on a clipboard. A uniform pass will be sent to students during the first block. We do not accept birks or crocs even with a pass.
- **I am feeling unwell** – go straight to the student services desk and check in, we can then contact home if necessary. Please do not contact home yourself without first checking in with us. Please note Panadol will only be given out in acute and emergency situations. You are welcome to bring your own panadol for us to hold at the student services on your behalf.
- **I am missing some stationery items** – Teachers will have extra gear to help get students started.
- **I have financial hardship and can't pay for key things to get my student started** – Please email principal@haurakiplains.school.nz or call the main office and ask to speak with Sharon.
- **I don't know who to contact about things** – You will be receiving a welcome email/phone call from your River guide within the next week. School App and Parent Portal

If you have not yet installed the school app on your phone, please follow these instructions:

1. On your phone or tablet, open the Play Store app (Android) or the App Store (Apple).
2. Search for 'school apps nz' and download the SchoolAppsNZ app.
3. Open the SchoolAppsNZ app and search for 'Hauraki Plains College' to connect to our school.

When we send out a message via the app, all users will instantly receive a pop-up 'push notification' on their device. Many parents enjoy the convenience of using the app to notify the school of their child's absence, as well as accessing the daily notices, school map, and staff contact details.

The 'Parent Portal' section of the app allows parents/guardians to access their child's attendance and academic results. Email studentservices@haurakiplains.school.nz to request your caregiver login details if you did not receive them, or if you are having issues logging in.

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



We look forward to previous teachers and learning support coordinators visiting our Hauraki Plains College over the coming weeks checking in with students and staff as we continue to strengthen our transition to College plan. "A number of studies conducted in New Zealand and internationally highlight that ill-prepared transitions can impact negatively on both student wellbeing and academic achievement. There is also evidence that the likelihood of students staying in school can be heavily dependent on the success of their transition into secondary school" (Education Hub, 2019).

Attendance Corner (see diagram above)

In 2026 we are aiming for 52%+ of our students attending school regularly (this means 90% of the time, or 9 days a fortnight). Each week we will share more information about attendance, as it will take a school and community effort to increase attendance.

Did you know?

- These reasons count as present: In class, work experience, gateway, medical appointment, board-approved offsite learning*
- These reasons count as absent (which negatively impacts attendance %): sick, at a funeral, car broke down and bus didn't come, holiday overseas, stayed home because it was athletics day, family emergency*
